HOW WILL CONCERNS BE DEALT WITH?

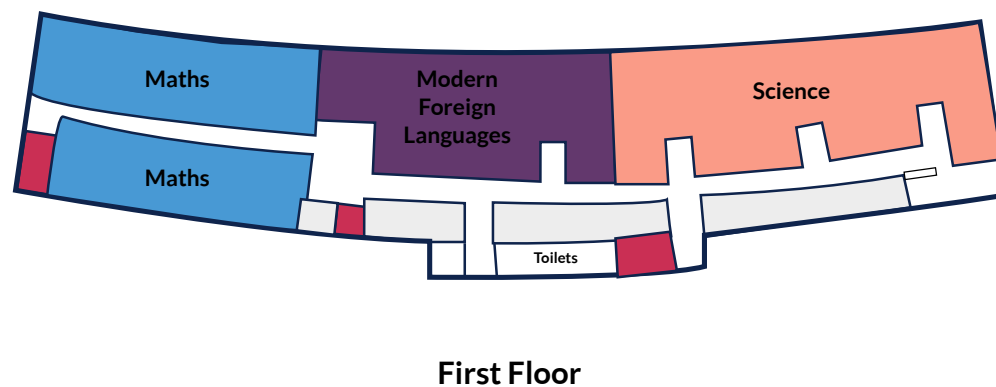
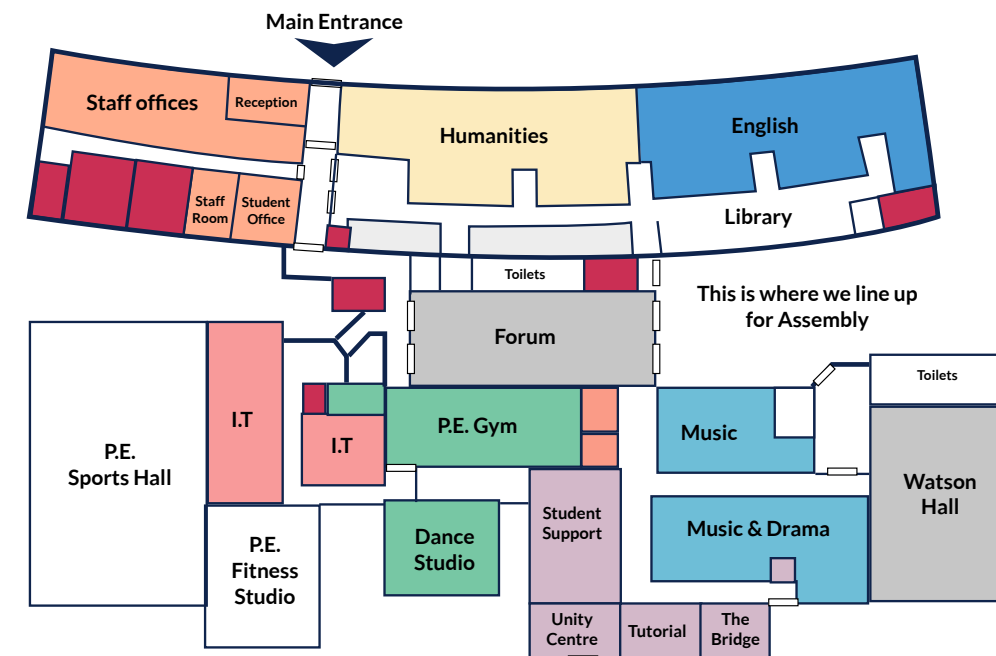
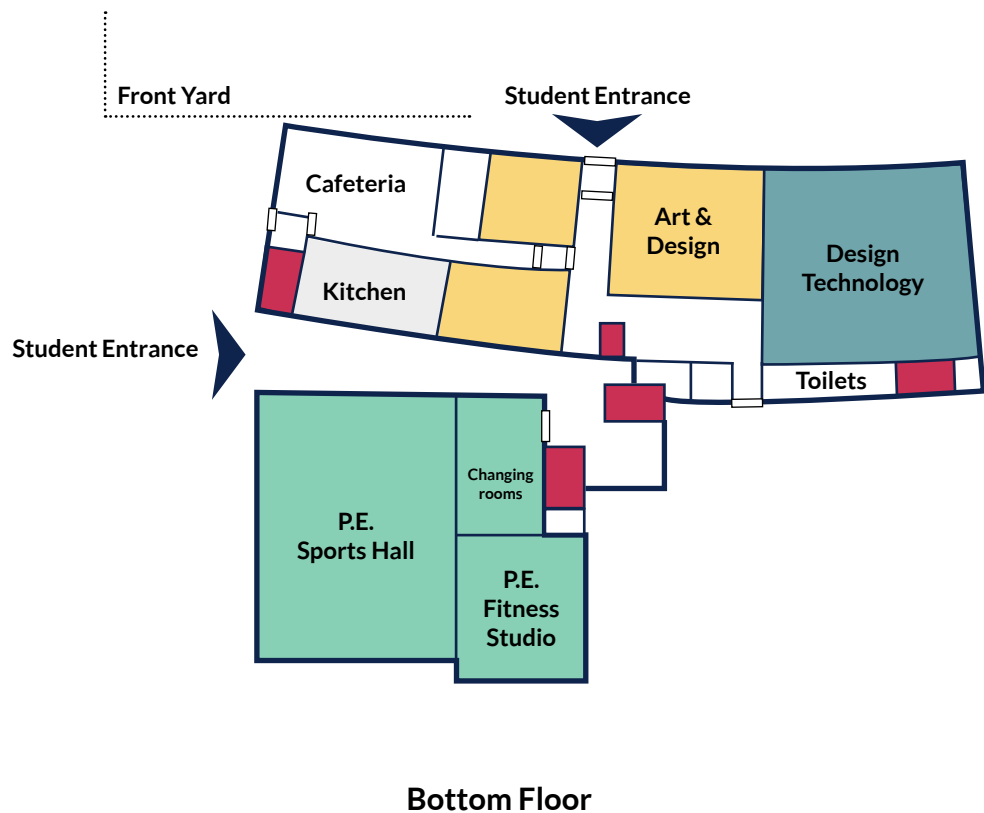
All concerns will be taken seriously and dealt with in a sensitive manner. Appropriate members of staff will be informed.

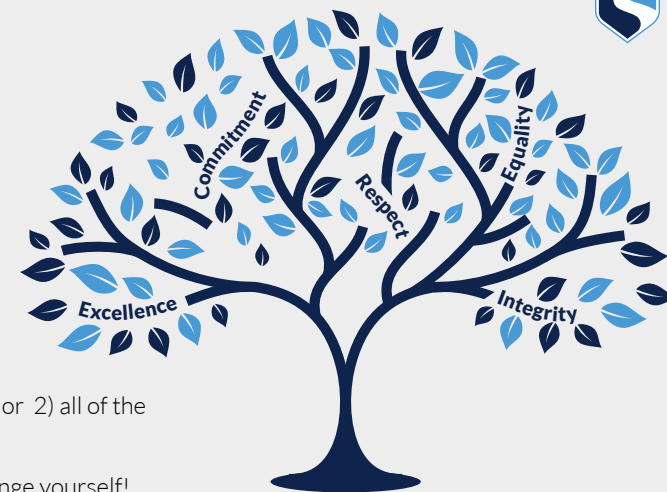

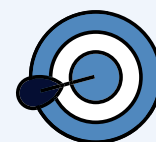

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Students who have 95% attendance or above achieve the **highest grades** or levels.

Students who have an attendance of 80% or less often **fail to achieve** their target grade or level.



ACADEMY UNIFORM:

Uniform Compulsory	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blue Biddick Academy blazer with school badge • Biddick Academy tie • Plain white school shirt buttoned to the neck • Plain grey trousers to the ankle
Uniform Optional	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Biddick Academy skirt, black opaque tights must be worn if students choose to wear the Biddick Academy skirt • Plain grey v-necked jumper
Footwear	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain black leather or leather style shoes
PE Kit Compulsory	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain white T-Shirt or white T-Shirt with Biddick Academy logo • Plain black shorts / Plain black leggings / Plain black tracksuit bottoms • Trainers must be worn during PE lessons
PE Kit Optional	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Football boots for football and rugby • Biddick tracksuit top • Plain white T-Shirt with Biddick logo
Equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student Planner: issued on the first day in September • Pen, Pencil, Ruler, Rubber • Reading book: available from the Academy library
Hairstyles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Severe haircuts including patterns are not acceptable • Hair should be a natural colour • Rainbow or brightly dyed hair colours are not acceptable
Jewellery	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One discreet stud in each ear is permitted, excess earrings will have to be removed • Body piercing is unacceptable and must be removed • A watch may be worn
Make Up	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discreet make up may be worn • No false / gel or acrylic nails: students will be required to have them removed • No brightly coloured nail varnish
Mobile Phones	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students may bring their mobile phones into the Academy but they must be switched off and in bags during the Academy day or whilst on Academy premises, including outdoors • Headphones and earphones are not permitted within the Academy

Further information on uniform

- Blazers should be worn at all times around school. At the teacher's discretion students may remove their blazers during lessons. Blazers must be put back on before students leave the classroom.
- The sleeves of the blazer should not be rolled up.
- No item of clothing (other than plain white shirt and Biddick Academy tie, plain grey v-necked jumper) should be worn underneath the blazer, for example, a hoodie or tracksuit top.
- Leggings must not be worn as uniform.
- No skirt, other than the official Biddick Academy skirt is allowed.
- White shirts must be tucked into trousers and skirts.
- Grey v-necked jumper must not be tucked into trousers or skirt.
- Outdoor coats are to be removed when entering the Academy building and are not to be worn in classrooms and corridors.
- Hairstyles must not be extreme: no unnatural colours or tramlines at all. No grade 0 haircuts either in part or full (head shaved). Pastoral leaders will judge suitability of hairstyle and hair colours.
- Caps and hats (or any variance of these) are not to be worn inside Biddick Academy
- Plain black leather style trainer shoes are acceptable; however they must be completely black leather.
- Suede and canvas shoes are not acceptable.
- Students must be correctly dressed before entering Biddick Academy and until they leave the Academy site at the end of the day. Any student not dressed correctly will receive an appropriate sanction in line with the Biddick Academy behaviour policy.
- The Academy is not liable for any theft or damage to property brought into the Academy.
- We understand that at times there can be issues with uniform that are entirely outside of parental control. Our aim will always be to work with parents when this occurs. Where a student falls short of our high expectations of presentation, we would ask parents/ carers to support the Academy and work together to reach a positive conclusion.

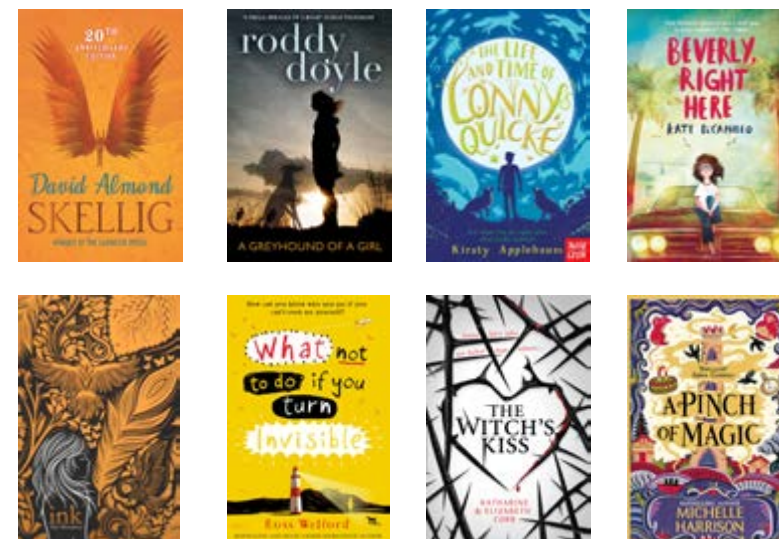
We have selected a range of books that we would like to suggest for your Summer Reading. We would like for you to read one of these books or a similar book linked to your interests.
