The study of Modern Foreign Languages at Biddick Academy is an important part of our pupils' education. Languages are part of the cultural richness of our society and the world in which we live and work. Learning languages contributes to mutual understanding, a sense of global citizenship and personal fulfilment. Pupils learn to appreciate different countries, cultures, communities and people. The ability to understand and communicate in another language is a lifelong skill for education, employment and leisure in both this country and throughout the world. In today's world, knowledge of a foreign language is often very useful, sometimes essential. It is necessary that our students can compete successfully when searching for employment. Many firms are now multinational and promotion can depend upon the ability to speak another language. Language learners have access to a vast network of international opportunities in fashion, science, design, theatre, retail, hospitality and business.

All lessons will include elements of interleaving and retrieval practice to enable learners to reflect on what they have learnt, allowing them to know more and remember more. Work completed by students will be marked and checked for understanding, identify misconceptions and provide accurate, clear feedback. Teachers will respond and adapt their teaching as necessary. Assessment is focused on listening, speaking, reading and writing - competencies which are learnt, practised and embedded into language lesson routine. Extracurricular clubs and trips provide opportunities for all students to immerse themselves in the lifestyle and culture of the target language country, as well as those of other countries. Teachers have high expectations of all students to ensure students are independent learners who take pride in their work. Teachers provide a safe, engaging environment for learning through classroom positive relationships.
