Government Emergency Alert

- As you may be aware from all the media publications the government are planning on sending an 'emergency alert' test on the evening of Sunday 23rd April 2023
- We are conscious that you may know parents or colleagues who are subject to Domestic Abuse and may have a secret phone that they hide
- They need to be reminded where possible to remember to 'switch off' or put in 'airplane mode' etc. as described below, or the phone will be activated on the Sunday 23rd April 2023
- The alert will say: "This is a test of Emergency Alerts, a new UK government service that will warn you if there's a life-threatening emergency nearby

In an actual emergency, follow the instructions in the alert to keep yourself and others safe. Visit gov.uk/alerts for more information

- This is a test. You do not need to take any action"
 Mobile phone masts in the surrounding area will broadcast an alert. Every compatible mobile phone or tablet in range of a mast will receive the alert
- > Your mobile phone or tablet does not have to be connected to mobile data or Wi-Fi to get alerts.
- You can opt out of emergency alerts, but the government advises you should keep them switched on for your own safety
- To opt out:
- Search your settings for 'emergency alerts'
- Turn off 'severe alerts' and 'extreme alerts'
- If you still get alerts, contact your device manufacturer for help


Modern Foreign Languages, Other Tongue Competition

Online Safety

Tik Tok

- You must be over 13 years of age to use TikTok
- > 60-minute screen time notification
- TikTok are introducing a 60-minute screentime notification for teen accounts (accounts with users under 18 years of age). When the time limit is reached, the user will be asked to enter their passcode to continue watching
- > Family Pairing: new features
- This allows you to link your own account to your child's account. TikTok have now added three new features:
- Custom daily screen time limits: this option includes choosing different time limits depending on the day of the week as well
- Screen time dashboard: this provides a summary of time spent on the app, the number of times TikTok was opened, and a breakdown of total time spent during the day and night
- Mute notifications: this setting will enable you to mute notifications at set times. Accounts aged 13-15 already do not receive push notifications from 9pm and for accounts aged 16-17, notifications are disabled from 10pm

- Instead, they should tell a trusted adult. You can use the tools within an app to report any offensive or hurtful content as well as block people so they cannot contact you again in the future
