A Message from our Deputy Headteacher Mrs Dickson

This week has been mental health awareness week with a focus on anxiety. Students have been discussing top tips on how to deal with anxiety in form time and linking this to characters in the books they are reading.

If your child is struggling with anxiety or worried about any aspects of their life encourage them to talk to their trusted adult at school. We have several interventions we can try to use as support strategies which include mentoring with the pastoral team, group work with specialist teachers in schools and referrals to the school counsellor. We also work alongside Washington Mind. We can also support with referrals to CAMHS and CYPS, if you feel your child needs more complex support.
