

Online Safety - Snapchat Quick Add

- > Snapchat's Quick Add feature allows users to discover other users based on mutual friends, subscriptions, and several other factors. Getting friend recommendations on Snapchat is common, and thanks to the Quick Add feature, users can easily discover and add friends
- ➤ However, Quick Add might result in users getting random friend requests from unknown people. If this happens, they might want to disable the feature entirely. Quick Add suggestions usually appear in the Add Friends section and search screen on Snapchat
- How To Turn Off Quick Add On Snapchat;
 - 1. Open Snapchat
 - 2. Tap your **profile** in the top left
 - 3.Click the **settings icon** in the top right
 - 4. Scroll down to 'Privacy Controls' and then tap 'See me in Quick Add.
 - 5.Switch the slider to the off position to remove yourself from Quick Add

The Big Ambition

- > The Big Ambition is a new campaign from the government which encourages children, young people and parents across the country to take part in a survey about what they need to make their lives better
- ➤ This survey is for all children and young people aged 6-18 and for parents/carers who can complete the survey on behalf of children aged 0-5
- This will ensure the government hear from early years settings all the way to colleges and sixth form settings. Adults can also assist children who are unable to complete the survey independently

Online Safety Bill

- At the end of October the Online Safety Act received Royal Assent putting rules to make the UK safer for children and young people online
- > Websites and apps must now be built with children's safety in mind, and tech companies will have to legally prevent children from accessing harmful and age-inappropriate content
- > They will also have a responsibility to remove illegal content quickly and enforce age limits and use agechecking measures on platforms
- > They will also be required to provide parents and children with clear and accessible ways to report problems online when they do arise
